I can't believe I am writing the final newsletter of the year! This year has flown by and I am proud to say that I have completed my first year as a Head teacher. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of the staff and Governors for working so hard and welcoming the necessary changes that had to be made to improve the education for our children.

Thank you to all of the parents for all of your continued support and feedback through the questionnaires, parent forums and discussions. We appreciate your honesty and welcome further feedback next year. Our final parent forum took place on Thursday after school – we still don't have a lot of parents who attend these although the parents who do attend have commented that they are a good opportunity to find out what improvements have been made in school that we don't usually hear about and to give feedback on how to improve even further. These have included learning walks, presentations from staff members and children, opportunities to review aspects of the curriculum and feedback. Next year, we will continue to run these workshops and dates will be placed on our school website.

Unfortunately, due to the lack of response from parents about the after school provision, Lincoln City are not able to provide the provision as intended in the letter that we sent out last week. Melody and her team will deliver an after school club which will be based on a booking system. If you require after school care, you will need to book in at the office on a Monday for that week stating the days and hours that you need. We can then arrange provision according to the bookings made.

During the Summer holidays, we will continue to develop our school environment and we will be creating a science and growing area at the bottom of our field. This will be used for all key stages. If you are able to help us during the week beginning 5th August, please come and join us between 10.00am and 3.00pm. We would greatly appreciate your support.
