Would you like to live in India?




In R.E we will: be exploring religious communities in our neighbourhood.

In Computing we will: learn about desktop publishing.

As athletes we will: have our PE days on a Tuesday and Thursday afternoon.

As authors we will: writing a narrative based on the events in the picture book 'Tuesday'. We will be learning to use inverted commas to punctuate direct speech. Later in the term we will be learning to write an explanation text, exploring the life cycle of a frog.



As scientists we will: be learning all about everything 'electricity'! We will explore appliances, circuits and learn about conductors and insulators.

As artists we will be: developing our shading skills and drawing techniques to create botanical inspired drawings.

As musicians we will: Have sessions led by Mr Roberts from The Lincolnshire Music Service each Wednesday afternoon! 😊

As readers we will: be reading 'The Boy Who Grew Dragons' during guided reading lessons. As our class text, we will be reading 'The Land of Roar'.
