This term we will explore the geography topic 'Why is the earth so angry?'

Our learning challenges for this term are:

To know what is under the earth's surface

To explain how volcanoes are formed

To explore how volcanoes affect people's lives

To explain what causes earthquakes and how they are measured

To know what causes tsunamis and explain how they affect people

To know what causes tornadoes

As mathematicians we will: be learning about fractions. We will learn all about the language of 'numerator' and 'denominator' before ordering and comparing fractions, adding and subtracting fractions and placing them on a number line. We will also be learning about improper fractions and mixed numbers. We will also continue using TT Rockstars to develop our multiplication and division. Please encourage your child to practise at home.

In R.E we will: continue to explore religious communities in our neighbourhood.

In Computing we will: learn about computer networks.

As athletes we will: have our PE days on a Tuesday and Friday afternoon.

As authors we will: develop our descriptive writing by learning how to write a setting description. We will use the book 'Rhythm in the rain'. Later in the term we will be learning the features of a diary before writing our own diary entry based on the book 'Voices in the park'.



As scientists we will: be learning all about states of matter. We will learn about solids, liquids and gases whilst also learning about the water cycle.

As designers we will be: designing and making mechanical cars that use different methods of movement.

As musicians we will: Have sessions led by Mr Roberts from The Lincolnshire Music Service each Wednesday afternoon! 😊

As readers we will: be reading 'Tilly and the Time Machine' during guided reading lessons. As our class text, we will continue reading 'The Land of Roar'.
