### Safeguarding news

Many schools have seen an increase in the number of children accessing content, which is not always appropriate, some of which has been quite scary or upsetting. While there is no perfect way to eliminate this risk, we feel that there are things parents and carers can do to support their children online. Here are some of the practical steps parents and carers can follow:

- Contact their Internet Service Provider (ISP): Companies that provide broadband such as BT, Sky and Virgin, offer free protection for parents and carers. They can filter your internet connection directly, without having to install anything. Guide on how to use this can be found here: https://www.internetmatters.org/parental-controls/broadband-mobile/
- YouTube is a fantastic resource, especially when home schooling, but not all the content
  is appropriate for children and not all YouTube channels are made for young audiences.
  YouTube has an app just for children YouTube Kids but many people don't realise
  that the main YouTube app has a restricted mode. Check out more about how it works

- Games consoles have features that can limit what games they can play based on the age ratings and can even turn off certain features to allow gaming to be a little safer. - Games are also rated based on the content, not how difficult they are. Learn a bit more

Topaz Class have produued some excellent writing and super science, investigating floating.








Emerald Class have enjoyed learning maths and creating Rangoli art whilst outside.
