This includes number bonds and times tables relevant to year groups.

Reading – your child is encouraged to read daily. Please continue to talk about what they have read and sign the reading diary.

Spellings – your child is encouraged to practise spellings as part of their homework. Or this may be sounds if they are learning phonics.

TTrockstars – if your child is using TTrockstars, the expected times tables for their year group or personalised targets will be set.
